June 4, 1935 - June 29, 2017

Charles L. Overstreet, 82, of Blue Springs, Missouri died on Thursday, June 29, 2017, at his home in Blue Springs.

Born Tuesday, June 4, 1935 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, he was the son of the late Fred Overstreet and the late Lola Ellen Nimmo Overstreet. He was preceded in death by his wife, Betty, one stepson, Timothy Helliker, and 2 brothers.
