Charles "Charley" Trigg, age 69 of Mayview, Missouri died on Saturday, October 4, 2014, at the V.A. Medical Center in Kansas City, Missouri.

Born Sunday, March 4, 1945 in Concordia, Missouri, he was the son of the late Jesse Isaac Trigg and the late Therese Elsie (Westerhouse) Trigg. He and Ruth Ann Gadt were united in marriage on January 22, 1988.

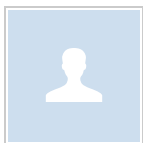
Tribute Wall

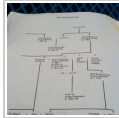
