Donald G. Wienberg, 85 of Warrensburg, Missouri died on Saturday, December 5, 2015, at St. Luke's Hospital in Kansas City, Missouri.

Born Saturday, August 30, 1930 in Emma, Missouri, he was the son of the late Elmer Wienberg and the late Lorene Bodenstab Wienberg. He married Betty A. Hickman on July 6, 1963 and she survives of the home.

Donald served in the Air Force during the Korean War from 1948-1952. He was a former police detective with the Kansas City Missouri Police Department until 1976. They then moved to Warrensburg in 1980.

He was a member of Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Warrensburg. He was also a member of Matthews-Crawford American Legion Post #131 in Warrensburg.
