F. R. "Frosty" Hoefler, 89 of Higginsville, Missouri died on Tuesday, July 17, 2018, at Meyer Care Center in Higginsville.

Born Thursday, January 10, 1929 in Higginsville, he was the son of the late Forest A. Hoefler and the late Gloria Boehme Hoefler.

He graduated high school from Kemper Military School and was a graduate of Williams Institute of Mortuary Science in Kansas City, Kansas, class of 1947. He served in the United States Army and was a Veteran of the Korean Conflict.

He was a life long resident of Higginsville and was involved with many areas of the community. A big part of his life was flying planes and loved being a member of the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association, he was a former Higginsville Aldermen, he was a member of Grace United Methodist Church, he was a former member of the Higginsville American Legion Post #223, he was a 32nd Degree Mason, and served as a former board member for the Citizens Telephone Company.

He had his real estate brokers license and served other funeral home owners with the sale of their funeral homes. He took over Hoefler Funeral Home Inc. as owner in 1976 until his retirement in 1989.
