



## John Pflugh

September 14, 1931 - December 27, 2020

John Leroy Pflugh, 89 of Higginsville, Missouri died on Sunday, December 27, 2020, at the Monterey Park Nursing Home in Independence, MO.

He was born Monday, September 14, 1931 in New Brighton, Pennsylvania and was the son of the late John Pflugh and the late Margaret (Shaffer) Pflugh.

John grew up in Pennsylvania and attended high school in New Brighton. After high school he joined the United States Army in 1947 and spent 4 years as an Infantry Rifleman. After his honorable discharge he reenlisted in the Army National Guard for 5 years. During John's civilian life he worked as a sheet metal worker for Westinghouse Electric in Pennsylvania. John was married several times and his earlier wives, Mary Pflugh and Andrea Pflugh both preceded him in death. He married Kathryn Martin-Pflugh September 15, 2008 and she survives of the home.

John was one with the Earth and enjoyed the outdoors. He was spiritual and felt something greater than himself, but wasn't necessarily religious. He was at peace when hiking, fishing, hunting or just taking in the vast beauty of the horizon. John had hiked the entire Appalachian Trail. He was an avid reader and was a well-rounded history buff. John was a licensed falconer in Pennsylvania and enjoyed hunting with falcons. He was inspired and intrigued with Native American culture and history. John enjoyed attending Native American Pow-Wows. He loved researching and learning anything he could on Native American history.

John also enjoyed making his own homemade wine. Chances are if you visited the house, you would go home with a bottle!

Surviving are his wife, Kathryn of the home; 3 sons, Michael Pflugh, Jeff Pflugh and Ed McGuire; 6 daughters, Cynitha Pflugh, Wanda Dolzenko, Lisa Pflugh, Sandy Pflugh, Jennifer Davidson and Rachael Moyer; 3 step-children, Lorrie Piercy, Lyanna (Wayne) Hamlin, Jim (Cathy) Martin, and many grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

A graveside service with military honors will be held at 1:00 PM on Monday, January 4, 2021 at the Missouri Veterans Cemetery with Rev. John Churchill officiating.
