



John Stephen "Steve" Inskeep

January 27, 1943 - February 29, 2012

John Stephen "Steve" Inskeep, age 69 of Higginsville, Missouri died on Wednesday, February 29, 2012, at his home.

Born Wednesday, January 27, 1943 in Boonville, Missouri, he was the son of the late James Orton Inskeep and the late Nona Mae (Dix) Inskeep. He was married to Helen Lucille Brown November 30, 1970.
