Mark Alan Nienhueser, 57, of Kansas City, Missouri died on Monday, April 19, 2010, at St. Joseph Health Center.

Born Saturday, January 24, 1953 in Marshall, Missouri, he was the son of the late Willard Nienhueser and Doris Hackett.

He was a lifelong entrepreneur of several businesses, and the self-employed owner at a restaurant lounge, retiring in 1994.
